THE WINE

Thompson Valley grown Marquette and Frontenac Noir make up this off-dry, medium-bodied Rosé. When pressed, the Frontenac Noir looks like a red wine even without any skin contact, so you'll notice it is darker than previous vintages.

Notes of fresh raspberries and Swedish berries dance on the nose and palate, unfolding into a juicy and well-balanced wine with bright acidity and a refreshing finish. Pair with a variety of salads - Thai quinoa; balsamic watermelon and feta; or even shrimp, avocado and roasted corn.

THE VINTAGE

Bud break occurred around the long-term average in early May and June's flowering process was right on track, taking place during the first and second week. We had plenty of heat in the first half of June and unlike 2018, we were thankful for a relatively smoke-free growing season, though 2019 ended up being a cool year overall.
